# Sharp rise in consumer confidence in March

- Morale amongst consumers continues to improve, moving back to its pre-pandemic level.
- With the exception of prospects regarding their financial situation, which have stabilised, all components of the indicator have picked up.

Fears of a rise in unemployment over the coming twelve months have dropped substantially. Moreover, consumers appear to be clearly more optimistic about the general economic outlook in Belgium.

On a personal front, households are expecting to save more. They have not altered their expectations regarding their financial situation.
