1. Access to OneGate via CSAM

Resident companies are now advised to log in to the OneGate application through **CSAM**, the government's online services portal.



This system is already used by the applications Intervat, Finprof, Dimona, DMFA, etc.

The CSAM portal combined with the OneGate module for access management offers a double advantage:

- 1. it allows declarants to manage the access of employees from the same company, as well as to invite third parties (accounting firms, fiduciaries);
- 2. it guarantees a higher level of security than the combination of a username and a password. With CSAM, the identification is done with an eID card reader or via *itsme*.

From 2024, only CSAM or a commercial certificate will allow access to OneGate. From then on, the combination of username and password will no longer be valid.

2. Transaction codes 71 and 72

New transaction codes have been in force since 01/01/2022.

Please note that from now on the codes **71** and **72** should be used for transactions with a view to/following customs clearance <u>not involving a change of ownership</u>, related to goods in quasi-import or quasi-export (see pages 2-12 of the <u>Intrastat Manual - Part II</u>). Code 99 can no longer be used for this type of transaction.

Examples:

Transaction code 71

A client in Italy requests that goods arriving by ship from the United States be cleared at the port of Antwerp and then immediately shipped to his warehouse in Italy.

Transaction code 72

A customer in France transports goods by road to Belgium to be loaded onto a ship at the port of Antwerp that is destinated for the United Kingdom.

3. Yearly revision of the Nomenclature of Commodity codes

The yearly revision of the Harmonised System (HS) for the year 2023 concerns 65 codes: 42 codes have been added and 23 codes have been deleted. From now on, the nomenclature will have a total of 9.755 codes.
